BARN100 WORKS START


Tenders for the Barn I OO project were received in May 2021, since when material prices have rocketed increasing the cost of works daily. Fundraising is in its infancy but due to tremendous support from our Barn supporters, Oxted Parish Council and Tandridge District Council, the Barn Trustees took the decision to allocate some cash reserves and to start works on Phase One as soon as possible, to avoid even more soaring costs.





PETER BUCK (REM)

In May 2019, Oxted's Barn Theatre was the site of something fairly extraordinary. Peter Buck – formerly the guitarist of American rock giants REM – was taking the stage, for one of only six European dates with his new band, Filthy Friends. Buck, an inductee of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, had headlined Glastonbury (twice!) with REM, but was now ready to appear in front of just 250 people at a sold out Barn Theatre. In his own words, 'I just love playing music for a crowd', and he clearly thought Oxted were a great crowd as, three years on, Buck is returning to the Barn.

This time, he is touring in support of a new musical project with British indie rock icon Luke Haines, formerly of influential 90s art rockers The Auteurs. Their collaboration has already produced an album, 'Beat Poetry for Survivalists' (receiving 4 star reviews from likes of Mojo & Q), with a second album in the works.

Haines & Buck visit Oxted ahead of two sold-out shows at London's legendary 100 Club, and will be joined by Buck's Filthy Friends bandmates Scott McCaughey (bass) and Linda Pitmon (drums).

Filthy Friends at the Barn Theatre in May 2019 was an unforgettable night: this show promises to be similarly special. After all, how often does a rock music legend come to Oxted?

November and December proved to be a busy end to the year for us, and in January we successfully filled the 120 front of house duties that were required for the ten-performance run of *Beauty and the Beast*. Thank you to everyone who contributed and also to those who have

already committed to helping with the large number of performances coming up in the coming months.

With the agreement of the Trustees, we took the step at the beginning of January of asking customers to make payments to the box office and bar by card only. This was done partly to improve the speed of service, but also to help us reduce the amount of cash handled at each performance. Foyer purchases for sweets, programmes and ice creams may still be made either by card or by cash.

The date of this year's Annual General Meeting has been set for Tuesday Ist March, and will be held in the theatre at 8.00pm. Official notification will shortly be sent to all members along with nomination forms for the Committee posts. Membership fees (which were waived last year due to the pandemic) became due on I January, and it is a requirement these must be renewed prior to the AGM, or membership will be deemed to have lapsed. The £10 fee may be paid by cheque, standing order, bank transfer or by card when you are next at the theatre. If you wish to renew your membership on the evening of the AGM prior to the start of the meeting, you are welcome to do so, but please arrive in plenty of time.
